San Antonio's Youth Action Board Founding Member Receives Statewide Award for Outstanding Community Service

SAN ANTONIO (October 5, 2022) – Kameron Rhys, founding member and the most recent President of San Antonio's <u>Youth Action Board (YAB)</u>, was selected for Texas Homeless Network's (THN) Outstanding Community Service Award for 2022! Kameron was presented with the award at THN's Annual Conference on Ending Homelessness in Austin on Thursday, September 29th, 2022. Kameron and Katie Vela, Executive Director of the South Alamo Regional Alliance for the Homeless (SARAH), acknowledged the award in an acceptance video that can be viewed here.

Kameron has an incredible story and has overcome many personal challenges that he now shares with others to advocate for solutions to youth homelessness. Kameron spent time unsheltered in San Antonio before connecting with the Thrive Youth Center program at Haven for Hope.

It was during Kameron's time with Thrive that SARAH began forming a "Youth Action Board" of local youth 17-25 who had experienced homelessness. Kameron was a founding member of the YAB and took on the role of the group's president in 2019. The YAB advised and informed on a youth-specific grant with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to fund new programming and partnerships.

San Antonio was successfully awarded the \$6.88 million grant in 2019 and has utilized the dollars to fund youth-focused street outreach, transitional housing, rental assistance programs, and, most recently, the YASS (Young Adult Stability and Support) Drop-in Center to create a safe place for young adults to access critical resources.

Through his service with the YAB and fierce commitment to ending youth homelessness, Kameron was appointed to SARAH's Board of Directors in 2020. In addition to his advocacy and leadership roles, Kameron is a first-generation college student at the University of Texas at San Antonio. He is pursuing a bachelor's degree in Sociology with plans to obtain a master's in Sociology. He currently works for Corazon San Antonio, a local homeless service provider, as an intake coordinator for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in need of resources.

Kameron's unwavering dedication to continuous self-improvement and his passion for helping youth has been pivotal in our community's success in addressing youth and young adult homelessness. In the future, Kameron aspires to build on his leadership



experience with the YAB by creating a non-profit organization focused on addressing the gaps and disparities in our current youth homelessness response system.
